Should you ever apply for a job which requires some cognitive science background you'll need to quickly review of the topics you have covered and the skills obtained in this class. Also, when you write the cover letter of your job application you'll need to include a paragraph or two about your cognitive science skills.

1. Generate a list of topics you have covered in class from beginning to last day and try to include skills that you have obtained. This can be any number of pages.

Examples:

Subject	Skills
Tri-level Hypothesis	<u>Biological or physical level</u> – “hardware” <u>Symbolic or syntactic level</u> – The “method” or algorithm <u>Knowledge or semantic level</u> –semantic, meaning between input and output.
Cognitive Modeling	Used COGENT, a cognitive modeling software to examine the effects of short-term memory.

2. Write one or two paragraphs, normally found in a cover letter for a job application that describes your cognitive science expertise. What you write should include all your cognitive science skills and not be confined to only the knowledge you obtained in this class. Do not exceed one page.
