Some pharmacy schools accept students immediately after they graduate from high school. Pharmacy schools that accept all or most students directly from high school are referred to as "0-6" programs because these students can complete their pre-pharmacy and professional study within six years after high school. Students enrolled in a "0-6" program who successfully complete the first two years of pre-professional study (and any other stated contingencies) are guaranteed admission into the four-year professional pharmacy degree program. Below are AACCP institutions classified as "0-6" degree programs.

What is an "early assurance" program? How does it differ from a "0-6" program?

In addition to the "0-6" programs listed above, there are many other pharmacy colleges and schools that offer "early assurance" (also known as "early admission") status for selected high school students. As with "0-6" programs, students who enroll under an "early assurance" program and successfully complete the first two years of pre-professional study, are guaranteed admission into the four-year professional pharmacy program. These programs are not categorized as "0-6" because the majority of students enrolled are admitted as "transfer" students after completion of at least two years of college. See Table 1 of the Pharmacy School Admission Requirements (PSAR) book.
