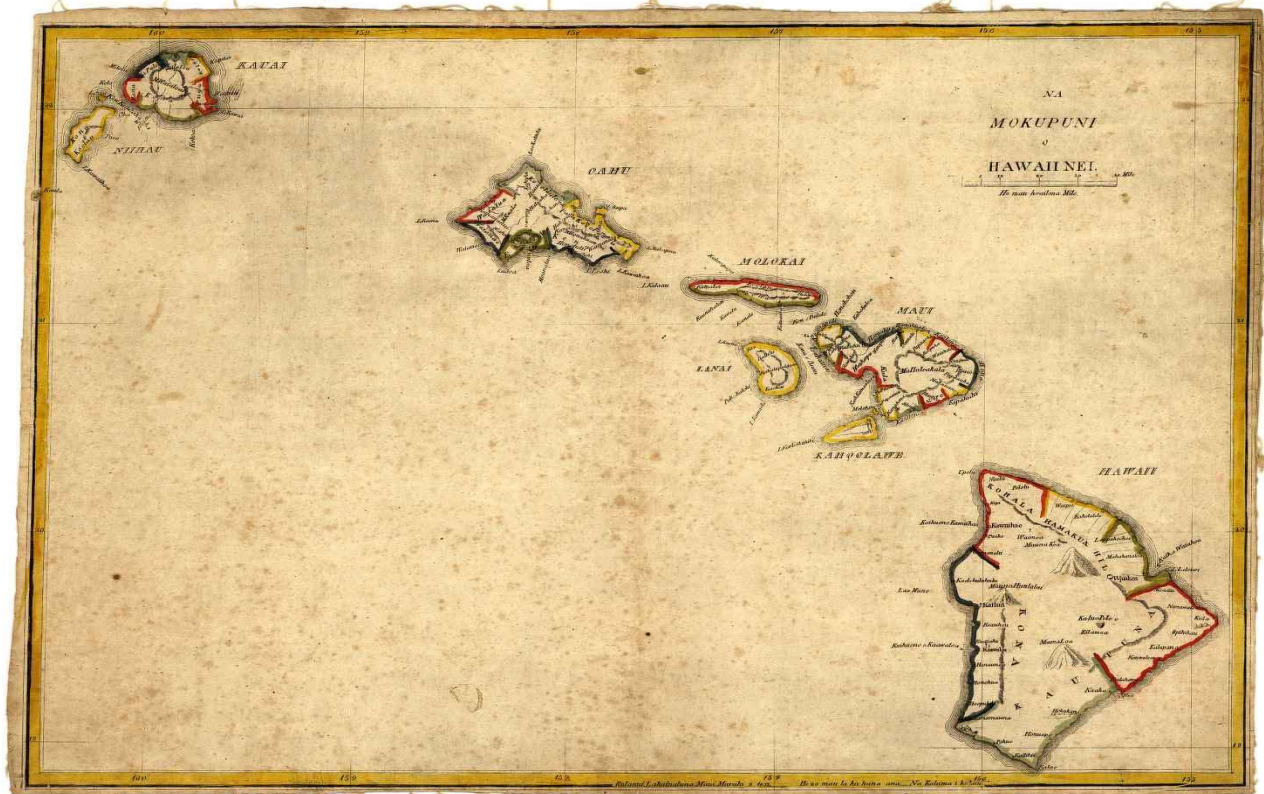

Renee Louis is a Hawaiian doctoral student in Geography at UH Mānoa. Her dissertation research: “Hawaiian Place Names: Mnemonic symbols in a Hawaiian performance cartography”, is funded by Ford Foundation and the NSF. Her research interests include; cartographic map accuracy, place naming orthography, Hawaiian cartographies, Indigenous methodologies, and geographies of indigeneity.
