

Projects of the BRC

The **Bisexual Resource Guide** contains listings of more than 2500 bi and bi-friendly groups in 49 countries, an annotated bibliography of books dealing with bisexuality, a guide to recommended films, information on available merchandise (buttons, T-shirts, books, bumper stickers, jewelry), safer sex information, upcoming conferences, calls for papers, forthcoming publications, and more.

The **International Bisexual Archives** include bisexual newsletters, magazines, tapes, articles, conference materials, Ph.D. theses, books, and other documentation of the history of the bisexual movement which furthers the study of bisexuality. The archives are an important resource to the community and have been used as a reference for several currently published works.

The **Bisexual Resource Center Web Site** at <http://www.biresource.org> provides worldwide free access to all BRC pamphlets, links to online bisexual groups around the world, and a host of other information including: opportunities for bisexual writers, a listing of bi conferences and events, safer sex information, political action links, news, and more. Information for bisexual youth, their parents and teachers is online at <http://www.biyouth.org>. The web site currently serves more than 5,000 visitors per month.

The **Bisexual Bookstore** is an online bookstore run by the BRC. The store includes more than 750 books about bisexuals

and bisexuality, and by bisexual authors. Commissions on books sold through the bisexual bookstore are used to fund the BRC's educational activities.

The BRC develops and distributes a series of **educational pamphlets**. Topics include (but are not limited to) myths about bisexuality, overcoming internalized oppression, starting and growing a bisexual support group, information for bisexual and questioning youth, teaching about sexual orientation, and safer sex. Through the **Prisoner Packet Program**, the BRC distributes informational pamphlets free of charge to any person incarcerated throughout the world, upon request. Incarcerated persons are often violently oppressed, and those of a sexual minority may have no resources to turn to.

The BRC promotes **bisexual visibility** in areas such as: gay/lesbian focused conferences and celebrations, conferences for women, spirituality conferences, health summits, and hopes to have a presence at national round table discussions by **hiring an Executive Director**. The **International Celebrate Bisexuality Day Festivities** have been held on September 23rd of each year since 1999, and have won the recognition of mainstream media such as the Boston Globe.

The **BRC** and the **Fenway Community Health Center** work in conjunction on **BiHealth**, a program which outreaches to the general community to educate about bisexual health issues.

The **Bi People of Color Gatherings** occur monthly. A warm and supportive atmosphere for bisexuals of color, diverse ethnicities, and their allies to connect and talk about their lives and issues.

The **Coming Out Support Group** meets twice a month in Boston. In addition to serving and building the local community, this is an important learning tool for BRC writers developing educational materials such as pamphlets.
