This letter asks you to join in an affirmation of support for the four interim leaders of Na Kumu o Kamehameha, both for the organization itself and, ultimately, for our school and our students.

Late Friday afternoon, Kehau Abad, Kawika Eyre and Gary Obrecht were required to report to the principal's office for individual meetings. There, each one was read a letter detailing violations of the employee handbook and put on official notice that further violations could result in disciplinary action, including termination. Charlene Hoe has received or will receive a similar warning. In legal terms, these meetings may be interpreted as due process warnings, and could allow instant termination in the future. The administration has made clear that it is choosing to interpret their actions on our behalf as the actions of individuals, not the actions of representatives of Na Kumu o Kamehameha.

We can all offer moral support for the four people who have been taking risks for us, and at the same time we can help establish our faculty association. First of all, please fill out and send the Na Kumu membership form to Gail Fujumoto as soon as possible. The form reflects changes we all discussed and voted on at the last meeting, and will give our faculty association a membership list with firm numbers attached to it. This is an important step towards formal organization.

Secondly, please sign the statement at the bottom of this letter and send it to me, using my home address (above). I am asking that you do this as an individual and a colleague, not as a representative of Na Kumu. The membership form will not be disseminated within KSBE, as we all agreed, but the signed statement below will be disseminated only within our institution. It is important to understand that both of these actions are within your rights. Neither is in violation of your employee handbook, and neither constitutes a formal step towards unionizing.

Why sign such a statement? The steps taken by the administration late Friday afternoon make it imperative that we take a more visible stance, to affirm the existence of our faculty association. The four interim leaders of Nā Kumu have not been acting as individuals these past four months; their actions have been authorized by the rest of us, the faculty of Kamehameha. We need to send that message to the administration and trustees in a clear, strong manner. Only a statement with names on it will send that message at this point, given recent events.

Another reason to sign the statement below: if we wish to retain them as leaders, we need to send an equally strong message to the four people who have been working these past months so selflessly on our behalf. Membership numbers are good, but names are even more reassuring. A signed statement will let them know that others are willing to be counted with them. In their place wouldn't you wish the same level of support? Please-think ahead as we form our association. Would other, future leaders of Na Kumu wish to represent an anonymous group of faculty members? If you look forward to the benefits of an independent faculty association, please be willing to stand up now as one of its supporters.

Please help to distribute this among your colleagues, and then discuss it with them. If fewer than 100 faculty members sign the statement, I will not do anything with the statement or the names.
